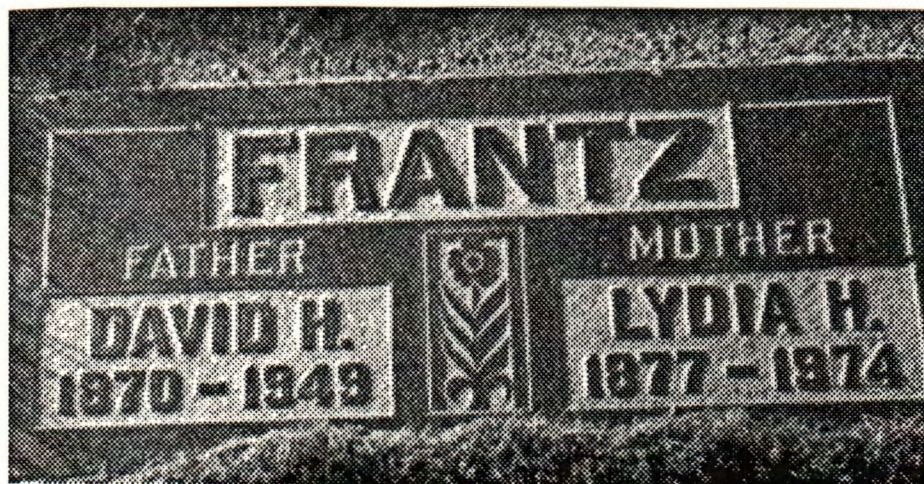

Introduction

My grandparents, David and Lydia Frantz, were long-time residents of La Verne, moving there in 1917 so their sons could avoid World War One by attending the Academy affiliated with the Brethren College. They celebrated their fiftieth wedding anniversary (1946) in a special event at the First Brethren Church. The newspaper clipping says, "When interrogated, both Mr. and Mrs. Frantz said that their family and their church affiliations have afforded them their greatest joy in their 50 years of life together. They made a number of moves during that time but always settled in a community with churches available."

They are buried in Section "H" of the La Verne Cemetery.



Ranking a close second behind my immediate family, my greatest pleasure comes from contact with aunts, uncles and cousins. Through genealogical research, I'm becoming acquainted with dozens of third and fourth cousins. Louise Larick is one such far-removed "cousin." Because of her long residency in La Verne -- and familiarity with Brethren history stored in the University of La Verne Library -- I contacted her for assistance in Brethren genealogy.

Louise had recorded numerous inscriptions during hundreds of hours spent walking the La Verne Cemetery. On December 10th, 1988 she entrusted her research to me. It has been a privilege for me to use my computer skills to document the information.

It makes me extremely happy to contribute to a book that may be of value to many family researchers. As I have benefitted from books and pamphlets regarding obscure cemeteries in the middle-west, genealogists living outside the Southern California area may find this volume useful.

I'm proud of my maiden name; I'm thrilled to learn (through genealogy) that I have strong "roots" in the German Baptist Brethren / Church of the Brethren. I dedicate this book, first, to the memory of my paternal grandparents, David Henry and Lydia Hannah (Traxler) Frantz. Second, born in Pomona Community Hospital (less than five miles from La Verne Cemetery), I have (through this publication) the privilege of returning something of lasting value to La Verne and Pomona.

The Sections are read "like a book" -- top left to right. (There are a few exceptions but they are identified.) All cemetery tombstone inscriptions were recorded by row and marker for ease in identifying family relationships, and printed text is presented in that form.

Single spaced names indicate a shared marker. Double spaced names have individual markers. Example:

Jane Doe 1898-1954

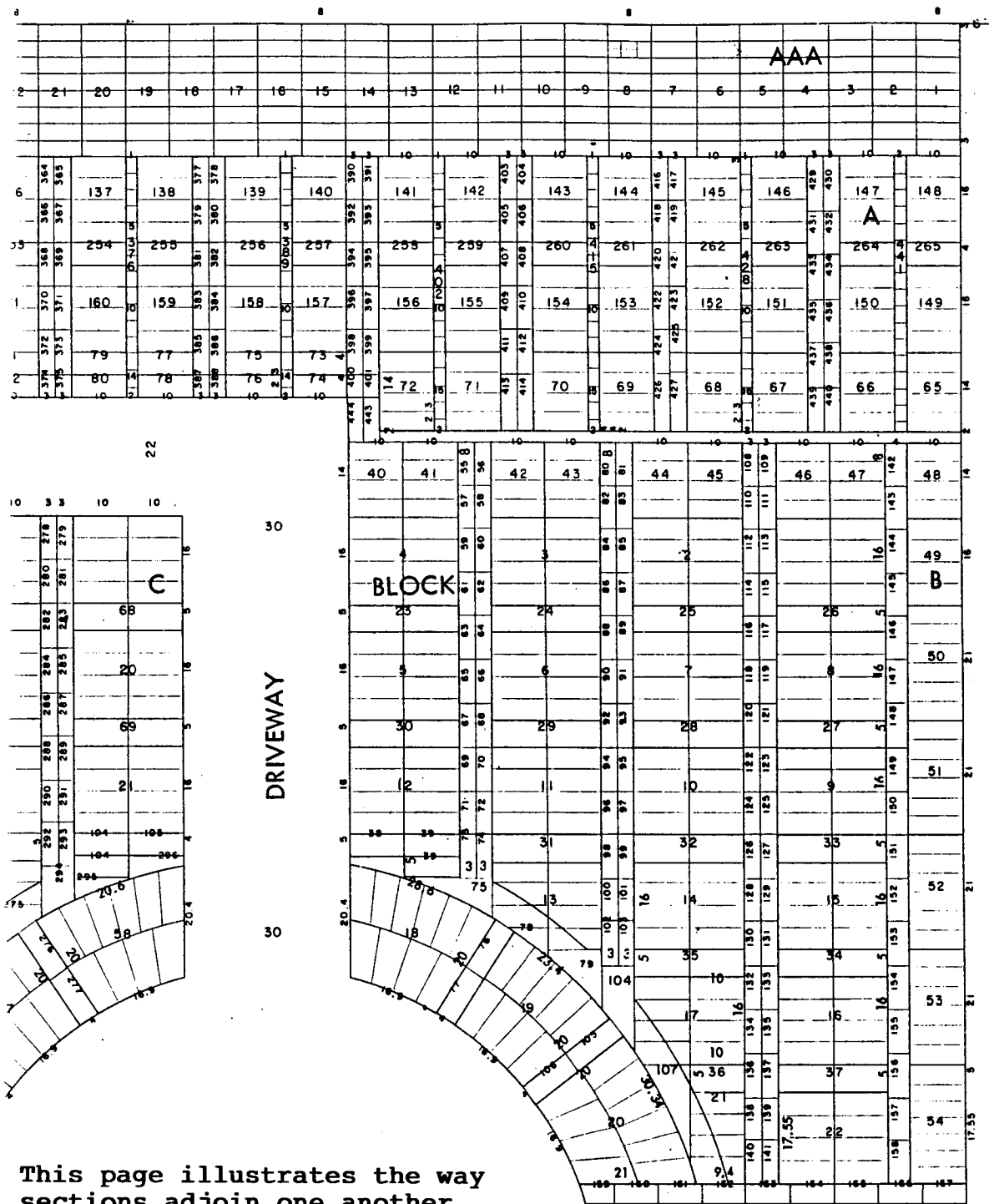

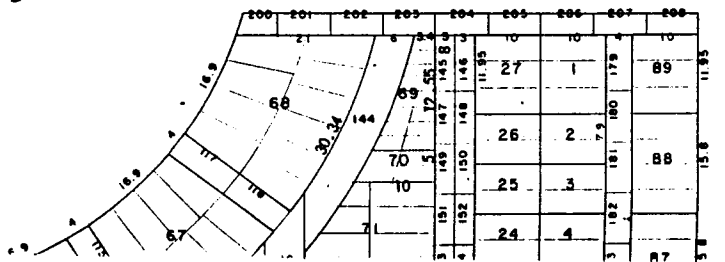
The Section / "Block" maps are not to scale. Specific areas were photocopied and "reduced" (from a huge map) so the identified area would "fit" on a page.

The phrase "zig-zag" is often used to indicate names (and markers) that are not in the defined row but in close proximity.

The word "Mason", "BPOE", etc., has been used to identify markers with an organizational symbol.



This page illustrates the way sections adjoin one another without clear distinction of where one ends and another begins. Perhaps the reader will have a better understanding of the need for occasional instructions to "zig-zag".

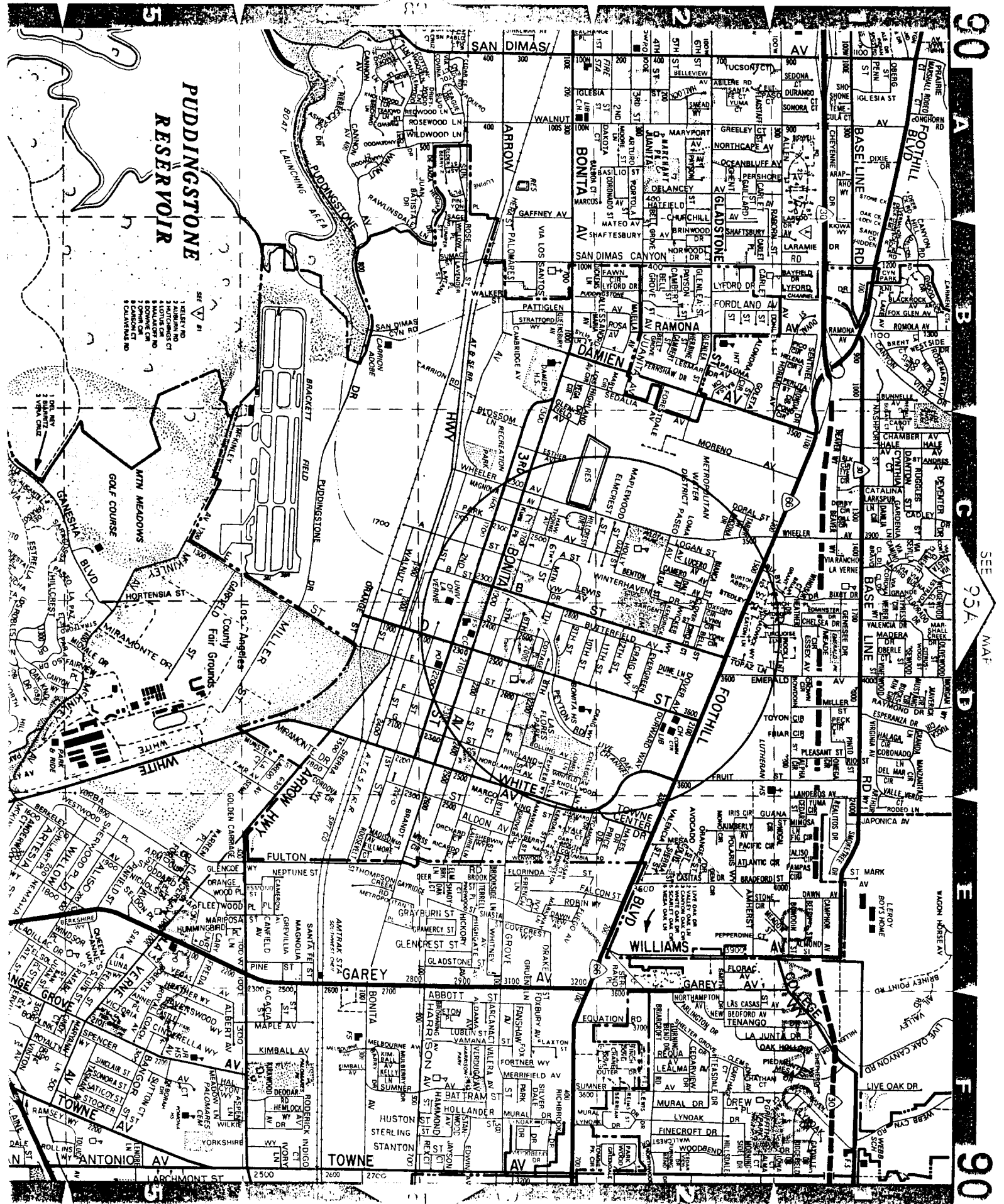

La Verne Cemetery
THE STORIES IT CAN TELL¹

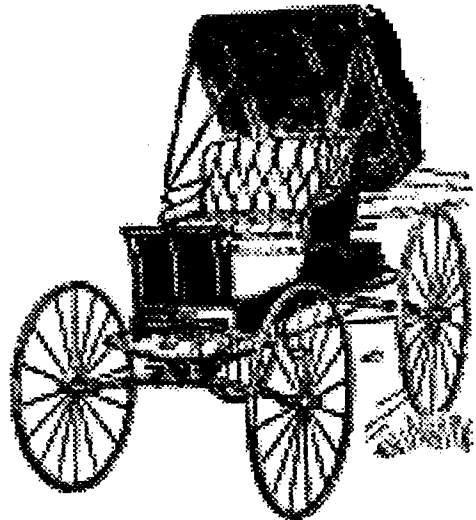
A cemetery is one of the greatest public libraries, full of forgotten stories, a record of the people who lived here and a connection between yesterday and today.

The ten-acre La Verne Cemetery, at 3201 "B" Street, between Bonita Avenue and Foothill Boulevard, has approximately 4,000 burials and room for 2,000 more. It was incorporated in 1903, by five men as the Evergreen Cemetery Association. The major stockholders were S.H. Harwood and H.C. Witmer. The others were L.C. Meredith, Frank Wheeler and Scott Carson.

Stuart Wheeler, resident of Claremont and a descendant of Frank Wheeler, explained the reason for starting a cemetery. "In those days we didn't have automobiles so we had to drive a horse and buggy all the way to the cemetery in Pomona. Therefore, not many people would attend the burials."

By 1903, the city of Lordsburg (now La Verne) had grown large enough to merit its own graveyard.

The middle section of the yard is the original area; some of the oldest stones are in this section. One of the prominent families buried in this section is the L.H. Bixby family that moved to the "La Verne Heights" area in 1885 from Pasadena. The name La Verne, for the settlement earlier called Lordsburg, was adopted in 1917 from the name chosen by Mrs. Bixby for their ranch in the foothills. She chose this name because of the "greenness" on the site of their home.



The Bixbys were prime leaders in the citrus industry. Mrs. Bixby (1854-1921) was responsible for seeing that a grade school and a high school were started.

Large tombstones were a symbol of wealth and prestige. A large stone near the Bixbys is for the Michael family.

William Thomas Michael (1855-1944) and his wife Sarah Irene Richards (1857-1918) came to La Verne from Kansas in 1891. They had two sons, Clyde R. Michael (1898-1929) and Wilford. William and his sons planted many acres of citrus in the La Verne Heights area. He was a real estate broker with offices in Los Angeles, La Verne, San Dimas and Pomona. He was one of the first in the valley to own an automobile, a Stoddard Dayton.

In the west section of the graveyard is the pioneer Barnhizer family stone. Charles M. Barnhizer (1861-1923) and his wife Blanch B. (1861-1936) arrived in Lordsburg from Palo, Illinois in 1911. They brought their daughter Ruth and son Robert. Accompanying them was another daughter, Mary Barnhizer Garber (1891-1938), and her husband. Another daughter, Anna (1887-1944) and her family, the Ira D. Butterbaughs, came in 1921.

They lived on a five-acre orange grove near the Jacob C. Price family, the Christian J. (1854-1939) and Sarah Y. (1866-1955) Brandt family and the Harvey Vaniman (1876-1944) family.

All were early 1900 settlers, and ranchers and are buried with various relatives in the La Verne Cemetery.

Of the Price family, mother Lillie Price Dredge (1863-1960) and father Jacob C. Price (1854-1922) and their son, John C. Price (1901-1960), former mayor of La Verne in 1946, are buried beside one another.

John C. Price was the football coach at Bonita High School. He coached one of the most famous athletes in the history of La Verne, Glenn Davis. Davis made his name as football player at West Point and later played for the Los Angeles Rams.

Several former La Verne mayors are buried in the cemetery. A.J. Morrison (1860-1939) was mayor in 1916 for four months. Eldo R. Blickenstaff (1881-1951) served as the city leader in 1938 for four years. Parents and brother of T.J. Stevens, mayor from 1918-1921 and again in 1942-1946, are buried in the cemetery.

Dr. John Edgar Hubble (1864-1936) was mayor from 1912-1914. But more importantly he was the first doctor in the area. His contributions were expressed this way by the Pomona Progress Bulletin on July 30, 1936: "Among the medical fraternity, Dr. Hubble was highly respected and throughout this district he was known as one of the 'old school' of family doctors. To the practice of medicine and the welfare of his patients, Dr. Hubble has dedicated his life and from such high ethical standards he never deviated. His natural friendly and sympathetic nature made his visits a benediction to the families he served."

He was known as the leading "baby doctor" of the area.

The Hubbles, who came to Lordsburg in the early 1900s, chose the town because of the college. The family was musically inclined and often had "Hubble Orchestra" concerts in their home. Dr. Hubble often took a music lesson, a load of hay or home grown vegetables in payment for his care.

His wife, Lauuna Carner (1877-1941) lies beside the doctor--their stone, almost white, with a vase in between each headstone and a physician's symbol engraved on the doctor's side, is located in the middle section near the back. Those in the community today who were delivered by Hubble speak highly of him.

John L. (1873-1972) and Grace H. (1878-1955) Miller rest under a flat headstone. Both in their own style contributed to the development of the city.

J.L. traveled from Missouri to Lordsburg in 1901, a time when orange groves were beginning to replace the apricot and prune trees of earlier years. He owned a general store downtown on "E" Street for approximately nine years until he sold out and purchased a chicken ranch in north La Verne. He was elected the first city treasurer and served for ten years. He also served as secretary-treasurer of the Mills Tract Water Company for twenty-six years and was superintendent of the Evergreen Cemetery. In 1970, at the age of 96, J.L. Miller was honored by the La Verne-San Dimas Kiwanis Club for his "special quality of life."

Grace arrived in Lordsburg in 1902 and was a tutor at Lordsburg College, where she received a degree from the college in 1941. She and J.L. were married in the college chapel in 1914.

Mrs. Miller received the first annual Community Builder Award from La Verne College. It stated "ever since you came to this community in 1902, you have given yourself completely and tirelessly to the influence which makes a community a worthwhile place to live."

Grace taught Sunday School, was a leader in children's work, the PTA, and the YWCA and spent many years teaching English to Japanese and Mexican-American citizens before any official programs were implemented in public schools. She helped organize the Emmanuel Presbyterian Church in La Verne, and in 1942 the Presbyterian Board of National Missions publicly honored Grace for her years of dedicated service.

Both J.L. and Grace were active members at the Church of the Brethren.

Two other pioneers, the McClellan brothers, are buried in the cemetery. William Dee (1861-1966) and Della K. (1886-1970) McClellan arrived from Tennessee in 1901. Dee's older brother James A. McClellan (1877-1956) had arrived a year earlier.

The two brothers started the McClellan Brothers Grocery Store, a business which they operated for seventeen years. They served many families in the surrounding area and deliveries were made by horse and wagon to outlying citrus ranches.

Dee was prominent in the real estate world and had an office in La Verne. He was honored by the California Real Estate Association for more than fifty years of service to California real estate.

A Democrat, Dee was appointed in 1914 by President Woodrow Wilson to be postmaster of Lordsburg (changed to La Verne during his six years term.) He was a charter member of the La Verne Chamber of Commerce and trustee of the La Verne Elementary School and Bonita High School.

James McClellan, the other brother was the first city clerk when Lordsburg became La Verne. He also served on the city council, was president of the Chamber of Commerce and helped organize the Volunteer Fire Department of which he was made an honorary member.

He opened a men's clothing store and dry cleaning business called the La Verne Cleaners which was located on "D" Street.

Many pioneers of the University of La Verne are in the cemetery.

W.I.T. Hoover (1869-1945) lived in the original Lordsburg Hotel and was president of Lordsburg (later La Verne) College for two years in early 1900. He then left to teach at three of the eastern Brethren colleges only to return in 1912 to serve as dean for twenty-six years and to teach philosophy until his retirement in 1939. The law library building still retains his name.

The next president of the college was William Cyrus Hanawalt (1869-1953). His stone reads "5th President of Lordsburg College." Hanawalt came from Pennsylvania and with his faith and courage, rescued the college from closing. He built the Hanawalt house, which is now the Child Care Center on campus.

William C. was the son of George Hanawalt (1831-1913), an earlier settler. George outlived two wives and is buried with his third wife Lucinda (1835-1929). The main contribution from George Hanawalt was his numerous children. There are more than twenty graves with the name Hanawalt in the graveyard. The name still means involvement as many of his descendants are active community members today.

Samuel Miller (1863-1953) served the college as president for six years beginning in 1915. Miller Hall a dormitory building, which is now condemned, was named in his honor.

Ellis M. Studebaker (1881-1954) former president from 1923-1938 is buried next to his wife, Lottie Rothrock (1881-1945), near the entrance to the cemetery. Studebaker served fifteen years as president, a longer term than any president before him.

Also buried in the cemetery is former President C. Ernest Davis (1893-1966), who served ten years, 1939-1949.

Besides presidents there is Gladdys E. Muir (1895-1967), professor of history, who has a room in the Wilson Library named in her honor. Benjamin Haugh (1873-1955) and Laura Haugh (1877-1949), recruited by W.C. Hanawalt, both contributed over thirty years of service to the college as music director and speech and drama teacher.

Jesse C. Brandt (1893-1980), youngest child of early citrus rancher Christian J. Brandt, and his wife, Kathryn Bomberger Brandt (1892-1971), lie near the Hanawalts in the far west section of the cemetery. Brandt was identified with the college for sixty-nine years. The relationship began when Brandt was a student in 1911.

He served as business manager, registrar, admissions director, dean and professor of mathematics and physics. He was an emeritus and honorary life member of the Board of Trustees and of the executive committee. Brandt received an honorary doctorate and professor emeritus.

There is a dormitory named in his honor on campus. All six of his children graduated from La Verne College.

Dr. Kevork Sarafian (1889-1975) gave more than twenty years of service on the faculty, six in modern language and twenty-one in the education department. Dr. Kevork Sarafian is father of the current president of the University of La Verne, Dr. Armen Sarafian.

Albert J. (1878-1940) and Stella A. (1878-1957) Brownsberger contributed seven children to the world all of whom received a Bachelor of Arts degree and a teaching credential from La Verne College. The college has awarded thirty-nine teaching credentials to Brownsberger descendants.

Another prominent La Verne man, Rev. Edgar Rothrock (1883-1945) and his wife, Bertha E. (1885-1963), came to La Verne in 1923. He was pastor at the Church of the Brethren and the college, but because he had nine children to support and send to college he opened the Rothrock Publishing Company in Pomona in 1929. Rothrock is responsible for beginning Camp La Verne, a camp with religious emphasis for young people in the San Jacinto Mountains.

Descendants of Daniel Boone are buried in the cemetery. They are John B. Boone (1890-1941) and Ethel Boone (1891-1949).

Mary Shively (1833-1922), a woman who outlived four husbands lies beside her last, Andrew Shively (1835-1910).

The graves of veterans are scattered in various sections of the cemetery. In 1939 there were twenty-five Union soldiers, four Confederate soldiers, and one soldier from the Spanish War. Now graves of World War I and II soldiers can be seen.

One of the interesting stones is in the shape of a tree stump with "Woodman of the World Memorial" engraved in the stone along with a Latin inscription.

Poetry can be found in the cemetery. "Asleep in Jesus blessed sleep, from which none ever wake to weep" is on the tree stone. One stone reads, "In my father's house there are many mansions" and the most common inscription is, "Vacationing in Heaven."

Sometimes the plot where a person is buried is ironically the only piece of property that person will ever own. For L.H. Bixby once owner of many acres of land, a plot in a cemetery is a rather humble possession but one that he will possess forever.

The La Verne cemetery is a place of serenity. It is a place worth visiting. Under the cold stones seemingly dead, dance tales laced with the brilliant history of our city -- La Verne.

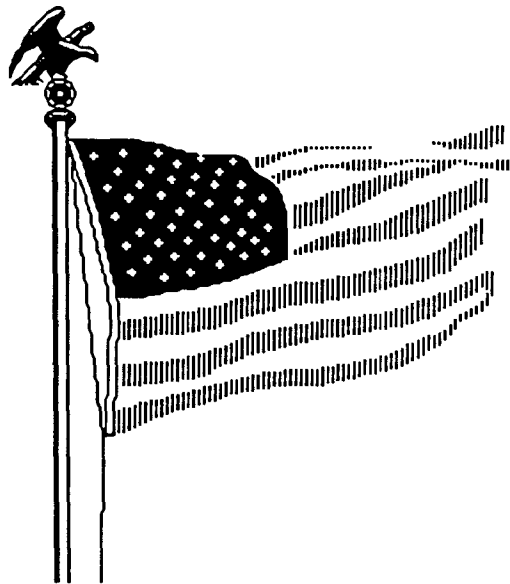
