Is there more to Rejection than what meets the eye? We would say yes! Rejection is not necessarily as simple as someone outright rejecting you, it actually functions on many different levels, some of which easily fly under our radar of discernment.

For example, a spirit of Rejection can cause you to feel rejected and set up a series of events to confirm to you that you have been rejected even if that is not, in fact, the case. It can hold you in a place of sorrows because it has you believe that you are unaccepted for whatever reason whether you have truly been rejected or not. Then it could even cause you to demand to be rejected by others in how you think, speak and act.

It can also cause you to reject yourself, a.k.a. Self-Rejection, this will tell you that you are not acceptable the way that you are and that you need to change something about yourself in order to be accepted by God, yourself or others.

Rejection can also cause you to reject others. So often we think of rejection as something that we are the victim of but sometimes it's hard to see that we are capable of rejecting others.

Could it be that there is someone in your life that you think is not acceptable; that there is some sort of flaw that makes them not good enough?

God says that while we were yet sinners He loved us. So if, in our messiest state, He thought we were acceptable how much more should we love each other who are really all in this journey together?

And this commandment have we from him, That he who loveth God love his brother also. 1 John 4:21

Yet another angle of Rejection is towards God. Of course, most of us know that God will not reject us but the enemy is sneaky and he can still slip in the back door when we are in a vulnerable position and convince us that for whatever reason we are not acceptable to Father God. But that is simply not true! The Word says that we were accepted before we were even created!

According as he hath chosen us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before him in love:

Having predestinated us unto the adoption of children by Jesus Christ to himself, according to the good pleasure of his will,

To the praise of the glory of his grace, wherein he hath made us accepted in the beloved. Ephesians 1:4-6

Rejection's main purpose in the enemy's kingdom is to divide. It will try to divide us from relationships with God and others and keep us from growing up into the person od created us to be; being separated from ourselves.

The best place he can get us is to separate us from the Shepherd and the flock and keep us isolated so that he can cause as much havoc and damage as possible in our lives. This will make us vulnerable to so many things including disease.

Don't you think it's time that we start rejecting the spirit of Rejection instead of ourselves or others? Don't you think it's time that he gets lost instead of the people he's tormenting?

Ye are of God, little children, and have overcome them: because greater is he that is in you, than he that is in the world. 1 John 4:4
